The hotel opened in 1988 and has operated as the Novotel Darwin CBD with Accor for nearly 30 years. It will continue trading under the Novotel brand on the basis of a long-term franchise agreement with Accor, delivering world-class distribution and loyalty programs.

Frontier Hotel Darwin: This 91-room hotel offers great value for leisure travellers, including an outdoor pool, fitness centre, and The Punters Bar, a traditional pub-style venue.

The Smith Hotel Darwin: This lifestyle hotel features 186 rooms, an outdoor pool, a rooftop gym, and an observation platform. Guests can enjoy Australian-Asian cuisine at D Bar and Restaurant.
